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The principle

Full and effective participation



- A cross cutting issue in the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities
- purpose (art. 1), general principle (art. 3), fundamental political right (art. 29), in relation to the rights to independent living and being included in the community (art. 19), **inclusive education (art. 24)**, habilitation and rehabilitation (art. 26) and participation in cultural life, recreation, leisure and sport (art. 30), children with disabilities (art. 7)

Meaningful participation

- Adequate representation
- Early and continous involvement
- Accessible and multiple forms of inclusion including reasonable accommodation (accessible information)
- Effective participation and consultation
- Capacity building, resources and advancing good practice
- Informed and transparent processes for representation
